The thirteen full-timers between them are paid about the equivalent of five (that's 5) "normal" salaries for comparab' positions elsewhere, but even this is a fairly solid slug when money's as scarce as it is around here. About two percent of our income goes in

royalties to the people whose records we play. Maintaining an independent news and current affairs service obviously involves a lot of communication, long-distance as well as local, and consequently the phone bill is horrifying, as are our power costs.

Then there are the usual and inescapable costs (stationery and other office supplies), chauffer-driven Commodores - you know the sort of thing) of staying vaguely organised.

And of course, one of the largest and most important areas of expenditure is the maintenance, repair, and/or replacement of technical equipment. Broadcast quality machinery doesn't come cheap, and since it's subjected

In fact, we're not at all short of ideas as to what we might do to expand our services (though if you've got any others, we're glad to hear them), we're just embarrassingly short of the financial means to implement them. LICENCE RENEWED

As subscribers will no doubt be aware, Triple Zed is still on the air notwithstanding TV news beat-ups indicating that we were in deep trouble at our licence renewal hearing in December.

In February, the news came through that our licence had been renewed, but that it had been shortened from a maximum of three years down to two.

The reasons given for the shortening were breaches of the Broadcasting and Television Act in two areas.

Firstly, and I suspect less significantly. our company structure had been in breach of the Act for much of the period of the last licence. This was a purely technical matter. It has been corrected. At no stage was there any suggestion that any individuals had benefited from the old company structure,

The main matter of concern to the Tribunal

of course, was what they saw as breaches of the provisions of the Act relating to the broadcasting of obscene, indecent, and offensive matters.

In a sixty page document setting out the reasons for their decision, the Broadcasting Tribunal rescinded their absolute ban on much of the sensitive material we had broadcast, but some songs remain, notably, Marianne Faithful's "Why Did Ya Do It".

It was indicated to us that if we were doubtful about the suitablity for the broadcasting of material we should check with the Tribunal first.

They say there is no absolute ban on the broadcast of particular language.

In deciding whether matters should be broadcast they list a number of factors which should be taken into account.

These include the nature of the audience. the time is was broadcast (gotta protect the kiddies), the context of the language (whether its use was gratutitous, and deliberately used to offend), and whether it was preceded by warnings.

The Reasons for Decision make interesting reading. The tone is not unsympathetic to Triple Zed. In fact ouite a few remarks are very favourable.

And despite the shortening of the licence. wowsers would be premature in assuming they'd had a victory. Within the Reasons there is an interesting section about those with "special susceptibilities over and above those of the average member of the community".

Just as this restricts us from delivering to our core audience material that would not offend them, but possibly offend others it similarly stops wowsers putting themselves in a position where they could expect to only hear material ineffensive to their tender sensibilities.

It's a difficult area, as the Tribunal readily acknowledges. No doubt we have not heard the last of the matter. But at least out of the decision some progress has been made into the unravelling of this issue.
