Nobody can do it as good as ZZZ and ZZZ can't do it without its volunteers. So keep it in mind not only for the shit work: Staffing stalls, cleaning up etc. but also for creative ideas. So start thinking and mail us your ideas or better still come along to any one of our Tuesday night station meetings. Its up to you!

After ten years, 4ZZZ has made its mark in vinyl with a compilation record of the best of current Brizbands.

Feature of the album is the jazz rock Revolutionary Chorus'
Joh Must Go, which sets off the timing for the album's release just prior to the Queensland State elections, and the theme for selecting bands of political interest - Crib Sex, The Edge, Trash of All Nations, Mop and the Dropouts, Trusted Few, One Big Union, Thanks for the Fish, Dog Fish Cat Bird, 1313 Mockingbird Lane, I Am Verticle, Wonderous Fair, Fiesta Tropical and Post No Bills.

This long awaited album is a first in Queensland where little financial basis exists for local recording and collaboration.

State of Emergence was made possible by the co-operation of Brisbane musicians, artists and promoters, Brisbane companies - Soundproof Stuios and Sundown Records, and Brisbane's only independent, alternative music station (that's us).

The album captures the reemergence of the progressive and
innovative music scene for which
Brisbane is well known. Thirteen
dollars and elevey dollars for subscribers - its coming to a record
store near you and at ZZZ studios.



-ANNOUNCERS-

In ancient Egypt when they watched the sun rise they believed that the sky was bleeding. For the record, those sun-crazed funsters also wore wigs dyed black, brown, white, platinum and aqua, liked to paint their toenails blue, and perfected a form of government that involved croneyism and staying in power till no-one could remember a time when the same person wasn't in power. Which may or may not have some relevance to the Queensland we live in today. I am positive though that those wiggy Egyptians would have appreciated a radio station like 4ZZZ.

OK, let's get back from the pixies. The subject of suns rising has been in my head because I've seen quite a few lately in my latest incarnation as a breakfast announcer at Zed. And while not full of poetic awe, my bloodshot eyes have recognised the amazing fact that I managed to get up most mornings in time to freak the milko out, and roar into the Mad Max mania that takes place on the roads at six in the morning.

Being a breakfast announcer is a curious job. On commmercial stations there are normally a host of paid people already working, staffing phones, fiddling with diodes, preparing news, preparing interviews, and keeping the ugliness of another day at bay. At Triple Zed a newsroom worker and the announcer twist themselves into knots trying to do all this, shrieking occasionally as one phone rings while I'm cueing a record, trying to take an accomodation notice on another phone, the air conditioning has died on the hottest day so far, the other record is in its closing flourish, I still haven't cued the other fucking record, and I'm still NOT AWAKE and this will go on for FOUR hours. Then try to sound like you're a reasonably sane human being on air.

But there are the moments that stick in the jelly of your memory. Like walking out to a dark kitchen one winter's morning and stepping ankle deep into a hideous soup that had overflowed from the university sewers and slithered up the outlet pipes into the back of the station. Or like having the announcing console die in action and the technician making running repairs with the whole top of the console flipped over backwards so that I'm staring at a spagetti of wires and to cue or play anything involves being double-jointed in the spine trying to reach out and down in front of me

about three feet.

Like getting some nut ringing every half-hour with a voice on a recorded tape loop suggesting a painful and slow end to my life.

Like spilling coffee down a crack beside a turntable

and watching steam fly out.

Like strolling out of the cell block into the foyer having finished another harrowing shift, only to be confronted by engineering students playing terrorist games in headclothes and sunglasses. declaring they had siezed the station and 'please, would someone take a photo of us.'

A few months of this and you can understand why a previous brekkie announcer took to wearing a pair

of mickey mouse ears every morning.

But it is fun and satisfying trying to breathe a little sanity into the early morning lives of Triple Zed listeners. And it is also a priviledge to be able to help in creating a pocket of resistance to the dog-eat-dog-eat-anything-that-moves world that is embodied by the institutions of power in this state.

Or rather, it has been. It's time to contemplate my navel and grow mung beans for a while, and by the time you read this Sue Williamson will be Triple Zed's newest full time announcer. Break a leg Sue, and watch out for those sewer outlets. Geoffrey Wood.



Now we have to live with the Drugs Misuse Act 1986, the secret to surviving in Queensland is to NOT TRAFFICK, SUPPLY, POSSES OR USE DRUGS.

The possession of 2 grams or more of Herion, Cocaine etc will result in mandatory (throw the key away) life sentence unless you are a drug addict. Possession of 500 grams of Marijuana or 100 Cannabis plants is punished by hard labour for life. If you unlawfully possess less than these amounts the maximum sentence available is 15 years imprisionment with hard labour. However it is up to the Police to decide whether such prosecutions are made in the Supreme Court or the Magistrates Court. Prosecutions in the Magistrates Court can only result in a maximum sentence of 2 years imprisionment. Fines of up to \$250 000 may also be imposed for convictions in the Supreme Court and \$5 000 for convictions in the Magistrates Courts.

It is also illegal to possess things for use in connection with the administration, consumption or smoking of a dangerous drug. This means possession of weighing scales, syringes, bongs and perhaps even tally-hos may be punishable by 2 years hard labour if there is evidence that they have been used as specified.

If you occupy or manage control over a place and permit your house to be used for the possession, supplying or trafficking of drugs you will be liable for 15 years jail with hard labour.

The Police State is everywhere when it comes to DRUG OFFENCES. The Police can and do place listening devices in your home and interupt private conversations. Police informers are protected by the threat of five years in jail to anybody disclosing the informers name or identity.

Remember the Queensland Police may search your vehicle, take your vehicle, take your clothers, detain your person, search your person, and take your person to another place while still under detention or under arrest, if they reasonably suspect such actions will provide evidence of a drug offence.

IF YOU MUST TAKE DRUGS, THEN LEAVE QUEENSLAND TO DO IT



SOME ESSENTIALS TO AVOID CONVICTION AFTER BEING ARRESTED

RULE 1 ONLY give the police your correct name and address.

RULE 2 ONLY give the police your correct name and address.

RULE 3 NEVER SAY ANYTHING to the Police apart from your correct name and address.

RULE 4 If the police want you to go with them, go with them, but don't say anything apart from your correct name and address.

RULE 5 Always remain calm and controlled, don't fall victim to Police pyschology. DO NOT aggravate the Police but never say anything to them apart from your correct name and address.

IT IS ESSENTIAL TO REALISE THE QUEENSLAND POLICE are not your friends, they won't do you favours. THE POLICE ARE AGENTS OF THE STATE, they are a drug users enemy and will do anything to convict you.

Under the Drugs Misuse Act there is no provision for Watchhouse bail: if you are arrested on Saturday, you'll be in all weekend, so be prepared for a silent, uncomfortable weekend.

DON'T SAY ANYTHING TO THE POLICE because from a seemingly harmless statement a Police verbal can be constructed. It is better to be bashed by the Police than go to sail for at least 2 years. The Police can not kill you, so take the beating and immediately upon your release go directly to a medical practitioner for a medical examination and get photographs of your injuries.

Upon your arrest you have the right to speak to a lawyer, if you can exercise this right and make a phone call. Finally until you go to trial you have not rights, so don't help the Police put you and your friends in jail, therefore don't tell them anything, never under any circumstances participate in a record of interview, and never make a verbal or signed statement apart from giving the Police your correct name and address.

I have known the deadly sins and more as well as I have heard of their invention. Good because it was pleasurable, evil because it was just as easy, but, my people, how you are so cruel for the sake of this economy I will never understand.

Here we do not love the environment or civil rights or equality or free speech or democracy. Here we love big buildings and quarries and money.

Queensland if only you would wake up and realise the horror of your past you then might see the desperation of our present where the worst are sane and stolid in their weight, where the best are lunatic to defy this sad, old man, his fawning henchmen, his cold authority, lunatic to prod this bovine mass that covets greed and despises all that it cannot consume.

But wait, I see a crazy horde charging onto the streets, on patchwork clothes they wear the colours of a thousand nations, see, their eyes shine in the sun, their strained voices laugh and cry and shout and whisper. Psychedelics delinquants feminists anarchists psychotics communists Krishnas Rastifarians pagans ecstatics Murris greenies prisoners junkies punks gays. Patriots all, its left to us to fight for the future, to kick and bite and scratch for the right to be human.

1URRI HOUR

The Murri Hour Collective is part of a Murri Media Association, which has a majority of voluntary, unemployed people sharing the responsibilites of the work-load.

Murri Hour has been operating out of 4ZZZ since late 1984, the first shows were · pre-recorded, all our shows are now live to air, the first live show was in July, 1985.

Two trainees are now employed full-time at 4ZZZ, they started in September, 1986,
 prior to this, no full-time Murri people were involved in maintaining our time on air, we had to depend on volunteers from our own community.

We still have volunteers that are trained at 4ZZZ, as they will be a necessary back-up, when we open our own production and on air studios broadcasting from our community in the near future.

At present we are looking at all avenues and costs involved in aquiring our own stud- ios and premises, although finding premises is very difficult because of a lack of capital funds and the wider community attitudes towards Murris in Brisbane.

4ZZZ has been and still is a valuable train-· ing area for us Murris and a lot of cross cultural barriers have been broken down since the two trainees have been on staff.

Murri hour doesn't try to compete or wish to be labeled in white terms of reference, we are on air to serve the needs of our community, a community that has a cultural heritage all can learn from. A community that is trying to pick up the pieces and put back together for our childrens sakes, an awareness and understanding of their people's beginnings on this Murri land and to stand up and be proud they are black. We have 200 years of pain to overcome, without hatred for the conquerors of our land and the process we are taking as a media group is a peaceful and Murri way of building self-esteem back into all of our community who wish to be involved. We have no bosses in our group and try to work together in all areas on a concensus basis.

Another area of our Media Association is a community newspaper, called 'Murri News', four copies have been published so far. But now that we have a full-time trainee employed at Merino Graphics, our paper should hit

the streets more often.
'Murriimage' is another section of our media, theis is run by three dedicated unemployed Murri people, who are trying to build up a service that operates from within the community.

MURRI-HOUR 4ZZZ, MURRI NEWS. and MURRIIMAGE is a community resource, for the Murri community and we try to listen and take direction from them.



Primal Moves are a Brisbane band who have been around for nearly three years in one form or another. The band consists of Chris Swane (guitar and vocals), Guy Nicholson (keyboards), Gavin Hammond (bass) and Steve Plint (drums). They started off playing experimental electronic music and over the years have developed a more accessible sound whilst still keeping their unusual and political edge.

The band was originally called Berlyn '33 and their songs, and indeed the name, were based around the theme of oppression (a subiect not unfamiliar to Queenslanders). After a few gigs, a couple of demos and the departure of their drummer, a new lineup brought the change of name and direction. Guy joined Chris and Gavin and the trio continued as Primal Moves without a drummer for some time. The new band reworked old songs, wrote and recorded new songs and bought new equipment to make use of their keyboards and drum machines easier live. After a couple of I visits to Sydney they eventually emerged with a publishing deal with MMA Music and quite a bit of interest from major record companies.

Not being happy with the lack of feel live that their drum machine gave, the band looked at forty drummers before finding Steve. Further new songs, demos, gigs, TV appearances and trips to Sydney resulted in more interest from record companies and the finalisation of the release of an independent record. A single called Crazy Eyes is due out in the New Year, hopefully with a video.

With this the band hopes to gain exposure and take their sound to the elusive Southern States.

The band's demos can be heard on ZZZ and they will be playing for ZZZ on Christmas Eve with the Reels and Wonderous Fair.

And no, we don't mean 'Knights in White Satin': we're not trying to dominate your listening tastes either - its just that some of us would rather take the Deep Six than sit through 'Kinko the Clown' again.

And you don't have to include 'Kinko' to have a chance of winning the big prize - every entry we recieve goes into a large forty gallon hat, to be drawn out as we play the top ten songs of 1986 on the first of January; so that's another spur to your creative juices. Along with the Radiothon, the Hot One Hundred is one of the unique listening experiences that 4ZZZ offers to its supporters. PROGRAMMING POLICY

Our programming policy is based upon the P.B.A.A. code of Ethics and 4ZZZ's Promise of Performance.

FORMAT: STRIP PROGRAMMING

Strip programming as a style was adopted for the purpose of maximizing the listening audience. Hence strip programming reflects the station's subscriber base and any moves to change this must consider the impact on the station's financial base. Similiarly, the Promotions section of 4ZZZ relies on this strip format to 'sell' by reaching the listening audience. Strip programming is a basic content of music, 24 per day. On 4ZZZ this is punctuated by occasional and specific 'block' programmes, news and current affairs content, Murris time and a limited amount of ethnic broadcasting, (ie. Iranian News and the Latin-American programme).

The music content is largely undefined but must contain 30% of Australian performances and 30% women's content.

OBJECTIVES

Every effort should be made to incorporate new programming ideas into the existing format. The collective recognises that:

(a) Some community needs can only be met by the introduction of specialized block programmes.

(b) 4ZZZ-FM has a responsibility towards marginalized community groups and to attempt to reflect community values not given credence in commercial, state or mainstream media.

(c) The style of strip programming must be preserved in order to preserve the station's financial base and

therefore its financial independence.

Comprehensive debate should precede and continue around each block programme. That debate would consider and apply the following guidelines.

WHAT JUSTIFIES A NEW BLOCK PROGRAMME

Lack of access to other media.

Avenues to incorporate ideas into existing programmes; eg. general current affairs into news programmes, general arts into overall strip format.

3. Programmes must not undermine or oppose the station's political and cultural objectives as set out in

the Promise of Performance.

4. Would such a block programme be an effective way of attracting people into the station who have information, contacts and perspectives that are not already apparent? The collective should also consider whether these people would be likely to bring this information into the station without a block programme.

- The station collective should consider whether the producers of the proposed programme have sufficient resources, time and information to present a programme of consistent interest and accessibility to listeners.
- The station recognises that some listeners will inevitably not be interested in some programmes. Producers should make efforts to ensure their programme is not completely inaccessible to the general audience although it may be more specialized.

7. That there are sufficent resources within the station to ensure adequate training of new broadcasters.

8. Will new listeners be attracted to the station through such a block programme and the publicity this will generate among special interest groups, who have previously been unaware of the station's activities and sympathy with their aims.

The station collective should always be aware that through the strip programming format the station must stract and maintain its listening audience. It will always be necessary to balance these seemingly con-

flicting considerations.


